<u>ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER</u>

For the purposes of ensuring the adequate implementation, use, and fidelity of the probation and pretrial services supervision techniques known as Staff Training Aimed at Reducing Re-arrest (STARR), the United States Probation and Pretrial Services Office for the Southern District of Illinois may utilize audio recordings with defendants/clients exclusively for staff training.

Any defendant/client participating in an audio recorded exercise will be asked to provide consent to be recorded and be advised his/her participation is voluntary. There will be no adverse consequences for any defendant/client who does not consent to be recorded. STARR training recordings will not be disseminated to any party outside the Probation and Pretrial Services Office who is not directly involved in the training initiative. The recordings will not be utilized to verify noncompliant behavior or the performance of a defendant/client on supervision. Recorded sessions will be saved in a local database and deleted once the recording no longer serves a training or evaluation purpose.
