## <u>ORDER</u>

Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 32 sets deadlines for the submission of Presentence Reports ("PSR"s) and the filing of objections thereto. For instance, Rule 32(f)(1) provides that parties must object in writing within 14 days of receiving the PSR. Rule 32 does not specifically address when counsel must file a *response* to the objections to the PSR. Unless directed otherwise in a particular case, counsel are to file and serve responses to objections to the PSR within 7 calendar days of receiving the objections. Failure to timely file a response to objections may, in the Court's discretion, be considered an admission of the merits of the objections.
